

### GOAL

## **SUMMARY**

All it takes is \$1 a day for the education for a child in the D.R. But for many families it is a struggle to afford the required school uniforms, supplies and monthly fees. The Student Tuition Expense Program makes it possible for the children to attend school every day.

## **DESCRIPTION**

\$1 a day—that's all it takes to provide an education for a child in the Dominican Republic. But many families cannot afford the required school uniforms, supplies and monthly fees. Without an education, the future is bleak for their children.

Genesis is a brilliant girl who dreams of going to college. Her father's salary as a pastor would not be enough to keep her in school—but thanks to the Student Tuition Expense Program (STEP), she is able to attend school every day. She is growing intellectually and is a model for her friends at school and in her church.

This project seeks to send 300 children to schools in San Cristobal, Bani and Puerto Plata in the Dominican Republic. This project is managed by IM missionary Madeline Flores-López. It is anticipated that this project will improve the overall self-esteem, education and future of hundreds of children in the Dominican Republic. An education will help break the cycle of poverty, giving each student the chance at better jobs and improving the overall health and vitality of their communities.
